Listed below is how Unity of Walnut Creek has celebrated Earth Day from 2021 through 2024.

- An annual ceremony on our Labyrinth celebrating our connection to the earth. We read our EarthCare Covenant and recommit to taking care of mother earth.
- Earth Day Ceremony at nearby Larkey Park (due to Covid no events or services happening on UWC campus). Introduction of new EarthCare Team, Spiritual EarthCare message, music.
- EarthCare Faire: Music, Raffle, Vegan Food Demo, Information on Ways to help save our EARTH.
- *Tending Our Sacred Grounds* campus cleanup. Ceremony; UWC campus gardening projects and clean-up; Plant-based potluck for all community members.
- *Tending Our Sacred Gardens* campus cleanup. Celebration of Earth Day with Ceremony; UWC campus gardening projects and clean-up; Plant-based potluck for all community members.

Here are some more ideas:

- If you are not certified as an EarthCares Congregation, apply to become one and announce its approval during your Earth Day services.
- In conjunction with an Earth Day festivities, play the song, "I Dream," by Lisa Firestone.
- Initiate a four or six week series called, "Environmental Fast Facts," in which two environmentally friendly ideas are published each week in the bulletin. Go to the EarthCare website for a sample program.
- Plant a tree on church grounds accompanied by a special ceremony.
- Give away tree saplings, bushes or flower seedlings to youth and/or the congregation.
- Through Youth and Family Ministries (YFM) have children make conservation posters illustrating how conservation was important to them.
- Have a Blessing of the Animals ceremony.

- Participate in local natural resource campaigns such as stream cleanup days, removal of non-indigenous plants, and planting of wildflowers.
- Tour local environmental discovery centers, sponsor hikes or visits to local natural areas, tour a solar or “Zero Energy” home.
- Organizing social time and fundraisers that are also active time like family bike rides or dances or jog-athons, and Installing a bike rack.

In the context of so much government action that erodes funding for support of the earth, let's not miss The New Story we are co-creating. Evidence of this New Story can be detected in the titles of the books that I now immerse myself in: *The Rebirth of Nature / The Greening of Science and God* by Rupert Sheldrake; *The Great Work / Our Way Into The Future* by Thomas Berry; *Coming Back To Life* by Joanna Macy & Molly Brown; *Rooted* by Lyanda Lynn Haupt; and *Talks On Truth* from Charles Fillmore. So many people write of our scientific principles and spirituality! Across the planet increasingly we share pictures of videos of saving creatures, while celebrating bald eagles nesting with real time webcam video. In Olympia Washington the Procession of the Species will take to the streets for the 25th year! (<https://oly-wa.us/procession/>) We are in an experience of mutual awakening-a world awakening to our common ground and home: earth.

It may be difficult to discern The New Story day by day, but for sure we are overturning the Old Testament Genesis story of humans designed to subdue the earth, what eco-philosopher Joanna Macy calls the Business As Usual model. Thinking that we can use the earth with only the thought of benefiting humans has led to The Great Unraveling which is our current experience. But there is more: The Great Turning. We in Unity and New Thought are poised to provide tools such as prayer, meditation and mindfulness, to center and stabilize the mind and heart during so much unraveling. AND, we have volumes of experience in the 'turning' of the mind to the Source of ideas. The answers we seek are spiritual, infinitely creative, and intuitively intelligent for the challenges at hand.
